Mr. McGath,

My wife and I would like to express our thanks to the employees that worked on our house last spring to insulate our kitchen crawlspace. Our kitchen had always been very cold in the winter and nothing I did seemed to help the situation. One option I was interested in was radiant floor heating; however that was not recommended over uninsulated crawlspaces. Icynene Spray Foam was the last and best method available to solve the problem. Initially, the job didn't seem that difficult. Only after we had made a hole in the sub floor that gave access to the crawlspace did the tricky part of the job emerge. One side of the crawlspace had only 9" of space between the bottom of the joist and the ground. While I'm sure it wasn't comfortable, the employees did a first rate job getting as much insulated as they could. Also, by trying to tackle the problem from the bottom up it save us time, money, and frustration by not having to tear up the sub floor and insulate from the top down.

Only as the weather has gotten colder have we really been able to appreciate the kitchen floor. Not a day has gone by when I haven't walked into the kitchen and thought to myself 'I'm not cold'. It is such a difference from previous winters when we had a portable heater in the kitchen and cold feet. Our kitchen remodel was a huge project for us, but it all started with the insulation for the floor. We would never have attempted everything if we couldn't find a way to keep the kitchen warm. After all, who would want to spend a lot of time in a room that was so cold?
